School Bus



Passing a stopped School Bus with its upper red lights flashing is not only against the law but dangerous.

- As a motorist you must stop when approaching a stopped school bus with its upper red lights flashing and STOP arm extended.
- Do not move until the red lights have stopped flashing, the STOP arm retracts and the bus begins to move.
- When travelling on a roadway separated by a median, and coming from the opposite direction, you are not required to stop.



First offence: \$400 to \$2,000 plus six demerit points

Drivers and vehicle owners will be charged if their vehicle illegally passes a stopped school bus. Fines range from \$400 to \$2,000.

Each subsequent offence: \$1,000 to \$4,000, six demerit points and possible jail time up to six months
