PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Send thank you notes from students to residents who are keeping sidewalks clear on school routes to positively enforce good winter clearance and safer passage for students.

PURPOSE:

This SOP will describe the process an administrator would follow to develop a successful Winter Clearance Thank-You blitz at an individual school, to list tools available at STSWR to support this process, and to describe the outcomes a school can expect upon completion of this letter.

DEFINITIONS:

Winter clearance: Shovelling and melting of snow from surfaces.

PROCESS:

In order to take part, a school Administrator must:

- 1. Engage teachers or parents who might support this project.
- 2. Have students create various thank you notes or design and print them as part of a classroom exercise. Learning points can include social responsibility, environmental sustainability, social connectedness, and active transportation.
- 3. Have students deliver notes to residences that are keeping sidewalks clear. This may be done as a classroom exercise during school hours, or Trailblazers or other students may deliver them under supervision after hours.
